So what:

- There is a lot of debate about whether Jesus existed or not. Most scholars and historians believe he was a real person, but the question remains of what that really means.
  - Was He the Son of God – the Messiah? Or just another guy?
- These artifacts do not prove, conclusively anything about Jesus (other than his existence and the movement that followed).

- These artifacts point to the accuracy in which the Bible describes Jesus' life, death, burial, and resurrection. The things used. The methods performed. They are indeed accurately shown throughout the New Testament.
- I hope these lessons in Archaeology give you a stronger belief of the Bible's accuracy which will lead to greater confidence in the truth it proclaims about Jesus as our Lord and Savior.
